

Final Results for the Roundabout Funding and Traffic Calming Devices (Speed Bumps) Petitions

The MWHO board appreciates all those who took the time to review the information and vote on the two issues presented to the Homeowners Association (HOA) as a whole. Below is a summary of the results and where we go from here on the two issues.

Roundabout Funding

This petition/ballot measure was to determine if the HOA should use up to \$4000 from the special fund toward the cost of upgrading the roundabout entry markers on Goshen, Peconic and Fern Creek. This measure passed so the Board will proceed with negotiating with Ada County Highway District (ACHD) on the final cost and the amount of the funds (maximum of \$4000) to be used toward the upgrade. Vote totals are as follow:

42 voting in favor of the roundabout funding

23 voting against the roundabout funding

Traffic Calming Devices (speed bumps)

The petition/ballot that was for traffic calming devices (speed bumps) was to determine if there was enough support on any of the three impact areas for the installation of speed bumps. The three impact areas of Muir Ridge, Goshen and Mayflower were developed from the traffic study conducted by the ACHD and the homes impacted if speed bumps were installed on any one of the three streets. Not one of the three impact areas received the required 75% support for the installation of speed bumps so ACHD will not entertain moving forward with this measure. Vote totals are as follow:

Muir Ridge	44 impacted homes	12 Yes	15 No
Goshen	56 impacted homes	11 Yes	20 No
Mayflower	44 impacted homes	7 Yes	13 No

We will continue to explore options of controlling traffic and speed within our subdivision. ACHD will install additional visibility on the signage at the Hollandale entrance. They will also provide their speed awareness trailer on a regular basis to remind everyone of the speed limit and how fast they are traveling down our streets. Upon request, the Boise Police department will provide assistance in monitoring the traffic within the neighborhood and issue tickets to those they find in violation. All residents are reminded that all of the drivers living in the neighborhood can significantly add to the success of this program by ensuring they maintain the posted 20mph speed limit.
